SEPTEMBER 13, 2018 The Strip District



Commonly misunderstood, especially by non-native Pittsburghers, to be the city's tenderloin, the Strip District never has been and still isn't. Instead, it's been the site of a Native American village, a summer retreat and a major hub of business and industry, notably the heart of Pittsburgh's fruit and produce trade.

It continues to evolve today, as Robert O. Stakely, an educator at the Senator John Heinz History Center, will show during his audio-visual presentation.

The Strip District now is a center for shopping, nightlife, cultural events, historic preservation and upscale restaurants such as Savoy and Luke Wholey's Wild Alaskan Grille. It also has become a quaint place to live and a popular tourist destination.

Attendees are encouraged to bring Strip District-related items or be willing to share stories about the neighborhood.



OCTOBER 11, 2018 "French Mary"

For the first time, Munchin' welcomes a costumed re-enactor. Her name is Cindy McShane, and she re-enacts French Mary. Without stealing too much of Cindy's thunder, French Mary was the nickname given to Marie Tepe (1834-1901), who served admirably alongside the 114th PVI Collis' Zouaves during the Civil War. She was born in France and is buried right here in Allegheny County.

Cindy calls herself a "living historian" and says she chose French Mary as her persona "to tell the story of a forgotten Civil War hero so all might know and remember, for as long as there is memory, great deeds live." She and her husband, Joe, are members of the Confederation of Union Generals and the 62nd PVI Company D in Armstrong County.
